

## **Fiscal Year 2010 Military Construction, Veterans Affairs, and Related Agencies Appropriations Requests**

**Project Name:** C-130 Engine Storage Facility  
**Request:** \$3,900,000  
**Service Component:** Air Force  
**Project Location:** Little Rock Air Force Base, Arkansas

**Project Description:**

All 19 MOS Engine Regional Repair Center (ERRC) engine maintenance assets, including spares, pre-teardown engines, extra QEC kits, turbine cans, rotor boxes, trailers, and mounts are dispersed and stored in widely separate locations. These facilities are no longer adequate to meet engine asset storage requirements. Some locations are enclosed, and lack proper resource protection capability. The majority of these assets are exposed to the elements. Funds will be used to provide a new facility.

**Project Name:** Combined Arms Collective Training Facility  
**Request:** \$962,000  
**Service Component:** Army National Guard  
**Project Location:** Fort Chaffee, Arkansas

**Project Description:**

Units preparing for deployment require collective training in a simulated urban environment. Urban environment training opportunities within the state of Arkansas are insufficient to meet the needs of soldiers and units preparing for deployment in support of the Global War on Terrorism. Construction of a Combined Arms Collective Training Facility (CACTF) would improve the combat effectiveness and survivability of all units within the region. This request would support completion of the design of the facility in FY10.

**Project Name:** Combined Support Maintenance Shop (CSMS)

**Request:** \$30,169,000

**Service Component:** Army National Guard

**Project Location:** Camp Robinson, Arkansas

**Project Description:**

The existing CSMS provides full-time maintenance support to every Arkansas Army National Guard unit within the state. The complex does not meet National Guard Bureau facility criteria to support administrative, storage, allied trades, and maintenance requirements of the Arkansas Army National Guard. Unfortunately, renovation of existing structures within the complex is not a viable option. It was built in 1955 and comprises only 50 percent of the required space. Workers currently conduct operations in 14 separate buildings within the complex. Inadequate work space and the separation of inter-related activities create potential safety hazards and minimize efficiency.

**Project Name:** Live Fire Shoot House

**Request:** \$125,000

**Service Component:** Army National Guard

**Project Location:** Fort Chaffee, Arkansas

**Project Description:**

Individual soldiers and units preparing for deployment in support of the Global War on Terrorism require "Live-Fire" experience in a simulated urban environment. Training opportunities within the state of Arkansas are insufficient to meet these needs. Construction of a Live Fire Shoot House would improve the combat effectiveness and survivability of all units within the region. FY10 funding would be used to complete the design of the facility.

**Project Name:** Security Forces Operations Facility  
**Request:** \$10,000,000  
**Service Component:** Air Force  
**Project Location:** Little Rock Air Force Base, Arkansas

**Project Description:**

A consolidated Security Forces Complex is required to replace existing structures that are not energy efficient and to consolidate functions that create operational deficiencies by their dispersal in three separate facilities on base. The consolidated facility will enhance the security protection Level 3 resources by decreasing the time required to generate, arm, equip, and dispatch emergency response and mobility forces. The new facility will provide improved span of control and speed the flow of administrative actions. It will also provide space to effectively manage Department of Defense security operations and Air Force base defense programs.
